# **MY ANTONIA – STILL CROSSING BORDERS**

*My Ántonia* by Willa Cather is a story of journeys. Journeys across borders, in a physical sense, of course -- across the ocean, across the country, from farm to town to city -- but also across borders of sensibility. Through the eyes of Jim Burden, we watch a host of characters move through time, sometimes single-mindedly, sometimes serendipitously, sometimes tragically, with a single goal: a better life.

For generations, similar journeys have played themselves out over and over again. For many members of our local communities, the journey to a better life begins in Mexico. And, like Cather's Ántonia, many of the sojourners are children. The borders they face are strong and foreboding. For immigrant children, and the children of immigrants, arriving in Southeast Wisconsin is the beginning. Across cultures, across languages, across educational boundaries, the journey continues. At the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, the student group Dream Scholars and Colleagues helps students navigate their way through the University as firstgeneration college students.



Since its inception in 2012, DSC has

worked to provide tuition aid to students who are classified as "out-of-state residents" for tuition purposes. In actual terms, this amounts to an additional tuition burden of \$8,000 annually. In addition to providing tuition aid, the group offers bilingual onsite high school information sessions for students and parents, campus visits for prospective student groups, and campus, classroom, and community presentations about the Dream Act, DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals), and tuition equity. On Tuesday, November, 17, 6:00, members of the group will tell the story of their journeys, from, as Ántonia calls it, "the old country," to university life. *Full program details can be found on page 2*.





Copies of the selections can be picked up at the circulation desk 3 to 4 weeks prior to the book club meeting.






### **AFTER SCHOOL CLUB** Every Thursday Afternoon!
