NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR



o16 is shaping up to be our busiest year ever. Please help us beat our 2015 circulation of 251,585 by checking out lots of items these last two months. We can do it! On our Work Day we decided to move

our Large Print and Fiction collections around, so you probably have noticed that already! We shifted our paperbacks, blu-ray movies, video games and adult graphic novels. Change is good, right? Don't hesitate to ask if you can't find something and we will gladly point you in the right direction.

After input from staff, community groups, and our Library Board, we now have finished and approved a Strategic Plan for the library. It is available on our website under 'About Us' and in print form upon request. As we work to implement this plan and reach our goals over the next several years, we hope to make some improvements to our building and services, like new landscaping, better lighting in some of our dark corners, new chairs in our

Community Center and additional meeting room space. Our dream of a children's garden is pending while a fundraising initiative with our Friends of the Library group is underway. We are extending any major groundbreaking to Spring 2018, while we apply for grants and raise funds. We did remove some of the older shrubbery on the West side of the building along Wisconsin Street this fall. A new raised bed for planting has been constructed on the south side along Court Street that we will use next year. When complete, we hope to have new flower beds, a fountain, and benches and seating for outdoor enjoyment. We are also still discussing parking lot improvements with the city. We want to avoid spending money on a new design that will not increase the number of parking stalls in our small lot.

LIBRARY TO SHOWCASE ARTWORK OF JAN CASTLE REED IN DECEMBER

he entire collection of holiday paintings by the late artist, Jan Castle Reed, will be on display at the Matheson Memorial Library throughout the month of December to showcase her incredible contributions to the city of Elkhorn.


Patrons will have the opportunity to see the entire holiday showcase of Castle Reed, who passed away in May at the age of 86. Her paintings continued the legacy of Elkhorn as the "Christmas Card Town" by capturing both the spirit and historic architecture of the city.

The large oil paintings are normally on display in areas throughout the library, but will be available for viewing together for the first time on the main floor throughout the holiday season.

Jan began as a jazz pianist [continued on page 2]

[continued from page 1] and singer, playing in hotels and supper clubs across the country. She also recorded a series of jingles and advertising for such clients as Brach's Candy, Speed Queen and Chevrolet.

She didn't pursue her passion as a professional painter until later in life when the Elkhorn Chamber of Commerce commissioned her first painting for the series in 1996 for "A Candle in Every Window".

Every year after brought a new Christmas scene or building captured from around town, including a painting of her own historic home (originally built by Frank Holton at 645 N. Church Street) named "Christmas Morning Greeting". Each piece took over 100 hours to complete and were reproduced as a collection of greeting cards over the years for the Chamber. Favorites are those that capture the joy of the season, children playing in the snow, and surrounded by the scenery that makes Elkhorn special.

Castle Reed became widely known as "Wisconsin's most versatile artist" for her talents and honored as Elkhorn's "Artist in Residence". The paintings were donated to the city and then put on display at the library for all to enjoy. She created a total of 15 paintings for the series until 2011, 14 of which will be part of the upcoming exhibit.


