





Both kits will be set up near the Circulation desk, and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. We hope you have fun making!





A probing and thoughtful exploration of race and class, this novel follows the life of an adoptee through multiple viewpoints.




BOOK-A-LIBRARIAN, OUR FREE TECH HELP SERVICE, IS GROWING!

This Victorian epic tells the story of Ernest Young, a half-Chinese orphan, the woman who adopts him., and the life he leads between the two Seattle World's Fairs.




