move to the library lobby, and the \$5 to fill a bag sale goes into effect. We have a very large selection of like-new books...check it out!


FRIENDS AUTHOR VISIT!




Complete with photos, case histories, eyewitness accounts, ghost lore, and directions, this unique presentation encourages you to visit these places for your own ghost story.





ELKHORN'S HOTTEST TICKET IS BACK! TRICK-OR-TRIVIA SIGNUP BEGINS SEPT. 8

fter a year-long hiatus due to COVID, co-chairs and trivia masterminds Katie James and Shelly Robinson are determined to bring the joy of Halloween trivia and costumes back to Elkhorn with the 8th Annual Trick-or-Trivia on October 23. The hottest ticket in town provides funding for next year's Matheson Memorial Library Adult & Children's programming.

The event, which started in 2013 with a small crowd of 30 patrons in the Elkhorn library Community Center, has amassed a citywide following with over 225 people in attendance at the 2019 event at the Monte Carlo Room.

James says the longstanding secret to the event's success has been the fun energy that brings patrons back year after year. "We have teams that aren't very good at trivia, but just love being silly together and hanging out for a good cause," she said.

This year's event will be held on Saturday, October 23, 2021 at Sperino's Monte Carlo Room located at 720 N.

Wisconsin Street in Elkhorn. Doors open at 6:00pm and trivia will begin at 7:15pm. *America's Pub Quiz* trivia master Bob Kordus is once again donating his services to emcee the event.

Both whole team tables are available for sale with 8-10 players for \$300, or individual seats can be purchased for \$30 for placement on any scary-smart team. A change from the 2019 event is the food: Two extra-large pizzas and salad will be delivered to each table so patrons leave full. "We learned that our players come hungry so pizzas stocked at the table will ensure those trivia juices keep flowing all evening long," James said.

Players are also encouraged to come dressed for success in individual costumes or coordinated with their table for a team theme. A costume contest/parade runs through halftime to keep the fun going, as well as a 50/50 raffle and silent auction to benefit the library.

"It's such a fun event and we are so lucky to have community support to keep it going for the library," James said.
