VHS Converter Now Available!

Convert your Treasured Memories to Digital with our New VHS Converter Maker Kit!

hanks to a generous donation from the Friends of the Matheson Memorial Library, we are now able to offer a brand new tool that allows you to transfer older **VHS**, **8mm**, **and Hi8 cassettes** to digital video files, which can then be saved to a USB drive or SD card, or even uploaded to a cloud service or YouTube!

Just bring in your camcorder (or use our VCR for VHS conversion) and get to preserving! For those of you

who prefer to transfer VHS to DVD, we also have a DVD burner and software to do this; all you would need is a blank DVD +/-R disc. We will also have a limited amount of blank DVD's and USB drives for purchase. **Please inquire about availability beforehand.**

This kit will be available for in-library use only and on a first-come, firstserved basis. Please call us to schedule an appointment, and to arrange a short tutorial on how to use the equipment. Keep in mind that each video will require its actual time length to record and you'll have to be there to monitor its progress during the duration of your conversion.






figuring out his true identity.

Friends Look Back on 2021

he Friends of Matheson Memorial Library (FMML) formed several years ago for charitable, educational, and literary purposes. FMML promotes use and enjoyment of our community's library. To accomplish these missions, FMML has several fundraising activities. Here are some of the ways we've helped in 2022:

FMML operates a bookstore in the library where we sell gently used books, movie videos, music CDs, puzzles, and games. This past year, these sales amounted to about **\$4,880.00**. In addition, our **two \$5.00** Bag Sale events brought in another **\$1455.00**.

FMML collects grocery receipts from Frank's Piggly Wiggly and redeems them by quarters to earn money for the library. The redemption of intact receipts (credit, debit, and check information blacked out on each receipt) added **\$1,512.00** to FMML's income. In addition, FMML worked two Brat Huts over the summer for an additional **\$1,221.00**. A big Thank You goes to Frank's Piggly Wiggly for giving back to the community.

After a one year hiatus, the Trick or Trivia Fundraiser at the end of October came back strong by bringing in about **\$6,500.00**. This money supports the programming at the library from youth through adults.

The money raised this last year funded the following activities and purchases for the library:

Youth Services: programming, Colossal Fossils, Incredible Bats, Food Science, teen supplies, Dinosaur die cuts, heavy duty book ends, and beginning chapter and early reader books

Adult Services: programming, two free Author Visits, Sounds of Sunset Summer Concerts in the Park, DIY alcohol ink painting, silk scarf painting, and wreath making.

General Library additions: updates to library garden (plants and mulch), new safe blinds for the Community Center, library subscription to Hoopla content, and purchase of VHS-DVD converter.

One popular series (Fridays with Oscar) will be on hiatus in 2022. During the COVID-19 pandemic, most new movies were made and shown through streaming services where the licenses are sold to individuals and cannot be shown to audiences. If any film buffs have ideas, please give them to a FMML member or the library staff!

The Friends of Matheson Memorial Library encourage everyone to become a member of this group of people who are dedicated to helping support the library, to bring new ideas and energy to the group, and to continue to make the Matheson Memorial Library one of the best libraries in Southeastern Wisconsin.




THE SHORT STORY BOOK CLUB
