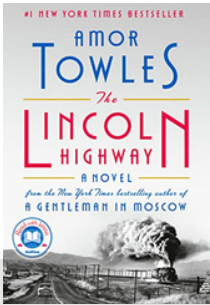

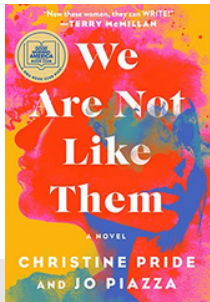
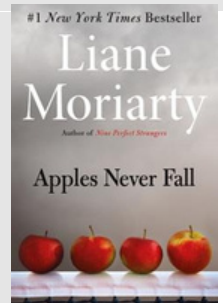

AFTERNOON BOOK CLUB

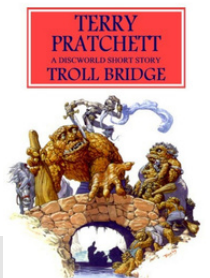
Meets on the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 2 PM

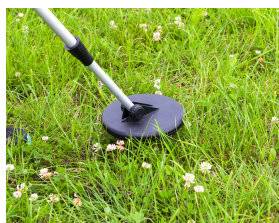


HOLD ON TIGHT

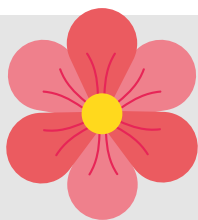
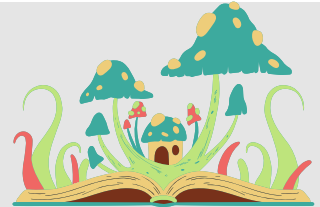
Thursdays at 10am in the Storyroom

Wednesday, June 8 at 10am

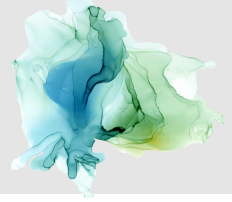
Weather permitting, join library staff in the family garden. We'll be digging, weeding, and planting as well as bringing out and dusting off our outdoor toys.

A TASTE OF FARMERS' MARKETS

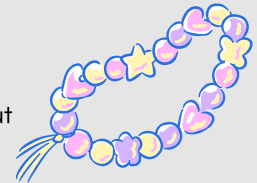
Tuesday, June 21 at 10 am
