Available Now!

The Elkhorn Independent and other longgone publications have chronicled our city's history for its entire existence. However, being able to read these papers has been restricted to microfilm and precious hard copies...until now!


The Matheson Memorial Library is pleased to announce that the first installment of a long-term project to digitize the *Independent* and other historical local newspapers is now available. By visiting the library's local history database via the library website, researchers can now read full issues of the *Independent* from 1855 to June of 1915.

Future installments will eventually make all issues of the *Independent* available through 2005 (2005 onward is already available through the Wisconsin Newspaper Archive, also available on our website).

In addition, other historical newspapers like the *Elkhorn Blade* will also be added to this growing online collection. These modern digitization files allow for advanced features such as keyword search, thus making research much easier.


