





The Friends of Matheson Memorial Library celebrated a decade of Trick-or-Trivia success on October 28, raising over \$8,500 to fund the 2024 Adult & Children's programming. Over 100 people attended the event held at the Elkhorn library that was again hosted by Bob Kordus of America's Pub Quiz. Guests worked in teams of eight players to answer general knowledge trivia.

The top prize of the night went to four-time champion team, The Smartinis, sponsored by Leece & Phillips, SC, who clinched the win by correctly putting Harrison Ford films in order of their release. Another highlight came when the group remembered long-time Friends member Barb Fischer with the presentation of a plaque to hang in the library and the auction of a special halftime question hint that was purchased by John Johnson of Genoa City to raise additional funds in Fischer's name.

Costumes played a big part of the event too. The best team theme went to Halverson Door LLC for their Dungeon & Dragons-themed costumes and 10-foot long dragon. Best couple's costume and donated handmade quilt went to Jamie and Amy Schamper of Byron, IL dressed as the Burger King and "Rhonda" McDonald. Schamper also won the \$630 50/50 raffle prize and donated it back to the event.

The Trick-or-Trivia committee was thrilled with the events' success at the library, but acknowledged a larger home will need to be found for all of their regular players to attend again in 2024. "We're just so grateful for these folks who come back year after year to help our library and we want to make it better for them each time," co-chair Katie James said. "The event was a blast and we're already talking through ideas for next year!"
