Happy New Year! For us here at the library, 2025 was a tremendous blur due our wonderful-yet-challenging grant. Between renovations, furniture selection, and many, many construction meetings, we certainly had our hands full. Thankfully, all of our library users have been very patient with us as we worked through all these issues...we really appreciate it! And even more thankfully, things are finally taking shape here!

We'll be starting our next phase in mid-January, in which the fiction and DVD collections will move into the newly renovated southern end of the lower level. However, these collections will still be fully browsable, and you'll get to see the first three new study rooms and our new Mary Bray Room! We think you'll like this space as much as our new Youth Services area on the upper level. In March, we're looking at a 2-3-week closure, but we'll do our best to offer at least limited library services as our construction crew finishes the lobby bathrooms, the main entrance, and finishes installing the new HVAC system. Then, our nonfiction collection can finally return from the Community Center to its new home. We're hoping for the entire project to be finished in May...or maybe even April.

There are programs happening even in the midst of construction, so read on for details on all we're cooking up for you. Don't forget that when you visit, we're here to help you find your next great read, so don't be shy! That also includes grabbing nonfiction books, which are definitely still available, though still in captivity in the Community Center. We're so excited to show off our new building, and stay tuned for a very special summer reading program utilizing all our new spaces. 


